

Findings from the Fall Course Interest Survey

A brief three-question survey was administered Friday, March 19 to all enrolled undergraduate students. The questionnaire was designed to assess students' preferences in course modality in fall 2021, inventory effective processes established during remote learning, and identify respondents' anticipated levels of family/work responsibilities. As of Thursday, March 25 (at 9 AM), there were 3,344 student responses to the survey. Overall, student demographics by race, including international student representation, first-generation status, low-income, and college affiliation are reflective of the spring 2021 undergraduate population. There is a slight over-representation of low-income students (40% vs. 37%), women (69% vs. 60%) and students from the College of Science (41% vs. 38%). Students from CEAS are also slightly
